Erie Together continues its forward progress to achieve the community's goals as reflected in our "impact plans." Action Team 1: Early Childhood Readiness and Success

- A new task team was formed to explore resources that exist for improving children's readiness and success in grades 1-3, in keeping with Erie Together's goal that 73% of Erie County children will be reading at or above proficient by the end of third grade by 2019-2020. More information to come.
- 2016 Summer Block-by-Block planning is underway. These events raise awareness of the importance of early childhood education and third grade reading proficiency. Erie Together is seeking additional partners and resources to reach more families.
- The Kindergarten Resource Distribution task team hosted a packing party to assemble
 Kindergarten Readiness Tool Kits. These kits are made available to local families through
 partner organizations, and are designed to help parents work with their children to build
 kindergarten readiness skills. Erie Together's goal is to distribute 1,000 of these kits into
 the community this year and next, and to collect and analyze data on the effectiveness
 of the kits.
- A task team was formed to take a close look at Erie Together indicators and data collection as it relates to impact plan goals. This group will make recommendations to help ensure that impact is being measured appropriately and is painting a clear picture of community progress (or lack thereof).



Action Team 2: Aligning Education to Careers

- The Career Street (<u>www.careerstreeterie.org</u>) task team is working with Career Street's
 executive director to secure additional participation in this countywide K-12 career
 exploration initiative. Additionally, the team is helping to enhance content on Career
 Street's website.
- A second task team is reviewing the annual 8th grade career awareness, exploration and preparation survey administered by Career Street in partnership with local public and diocesan schools in Erie County each May. The team is making slight revisions to the survey to help students more accurately answer key questions, and is also developing a script for teachers to use as they introduce the survey to students. The purpose of this team's work is to ensure we are collecting the most accurate data from 8th graders about their career awareness, exploration and preparation.
- A team has been assembled to focus on the development of a local college and career pathways system to better prepare today's students for tomorrow's careers. This work will be supported through a relationship with the National Center for College & Career Transitions (www.nc3t.com) who will provide technical assistance to the group.
- The More Caps and Gowns mentoring pilot project at Girard Middle School is producing positive results for the 6th grade student participants. Mercyhurst University has reflected on lessons learned through the Girard pilot and is now exploring opportunities to launch a similar effort with another local middle school.
- A Best Practices for Parent Engagement training is scheduled for April 21, 2016. This
 series of free professional development trainings is part of a partnership between Erie
 Together, United Way of Erie County, Unified Erie, and the Nonprofit Partnership. All of

Action Team 3: Individual and Family Stability

- A mentor training is being held on April 8th from 8:30 AM to 12:00 PM at GECAC for individuals wishing to volunteer as mentors through the Family Action Team (FACT) process.  - Targeted mentor recruitment is underway with specific groups including yep!, labor unions, and others.
 - A new task team has been formed to create a 'buzz' around FACTs. The team will be reviewing existing materials and looking for ways to spread the word to increase participation.

- Erie Together task teams developed a social media plan to promote the Gannon Human Services Directory (hsd.gannon.edu). Each month as a specific focus which links back to the directory. Like, follow, and share (@erietogether) on the 3rd of each month to help connect more families to this important resource. Gannon will also be sending a request for updates via email twice each year to ensure organizations are updating information.
- The Healthy Life Self-Assessment is a new resource from Erie Together. The checklists helps individuals see the importance of physical, mental, spiritual, and social relationships and goal setting as they work toward self-sufficiency. - A new task team was formed to gather success stories from FACT participants. The group will work with past and present facilitators to help collect these stories and also to engage these participants in the broader Erie Together movement.

Action Team 4: Aligning Workforce and Economic Development

- The Erie County Reentry Services and Support Alliance (ECRSSA) Planning Group
 recently held an informational session for potential service providers. The session
 included background on the alliance, strategy highlights, and a question and answer
 period for providers. The next steps for the ECRSSA are to: (1) secure funding; (2) work
 with partner organization to house, recruit and train staff; and (3) launch the ECRSSA.
- A task team focused on employer and employee satisfaction is working with CareerLink to gauge satisfaction with current workforce development supports. More to come.
- Erie Together is focused on helping to increase workplace diversity which will benefit
 local employers and the community alike. As a first step, a task team is using existing
 research and best practice information to put together a piece to help inform local
 organizations about the importance and positive implications of workplace diversity and
 inclusive leadership. Once this resource is finished and vetted with local employers, the
 group will consider appropriate next steps.

Miscellaneous:

 Erie Together will be presented with the Community Action Association of Pennsylvania (CAAP)'s 2016 Distinguished Community Engagement Award on April 21st in Harrisburg. This recognition is a testament to the tremendous work being done by all involved in the Erie Together movement.
